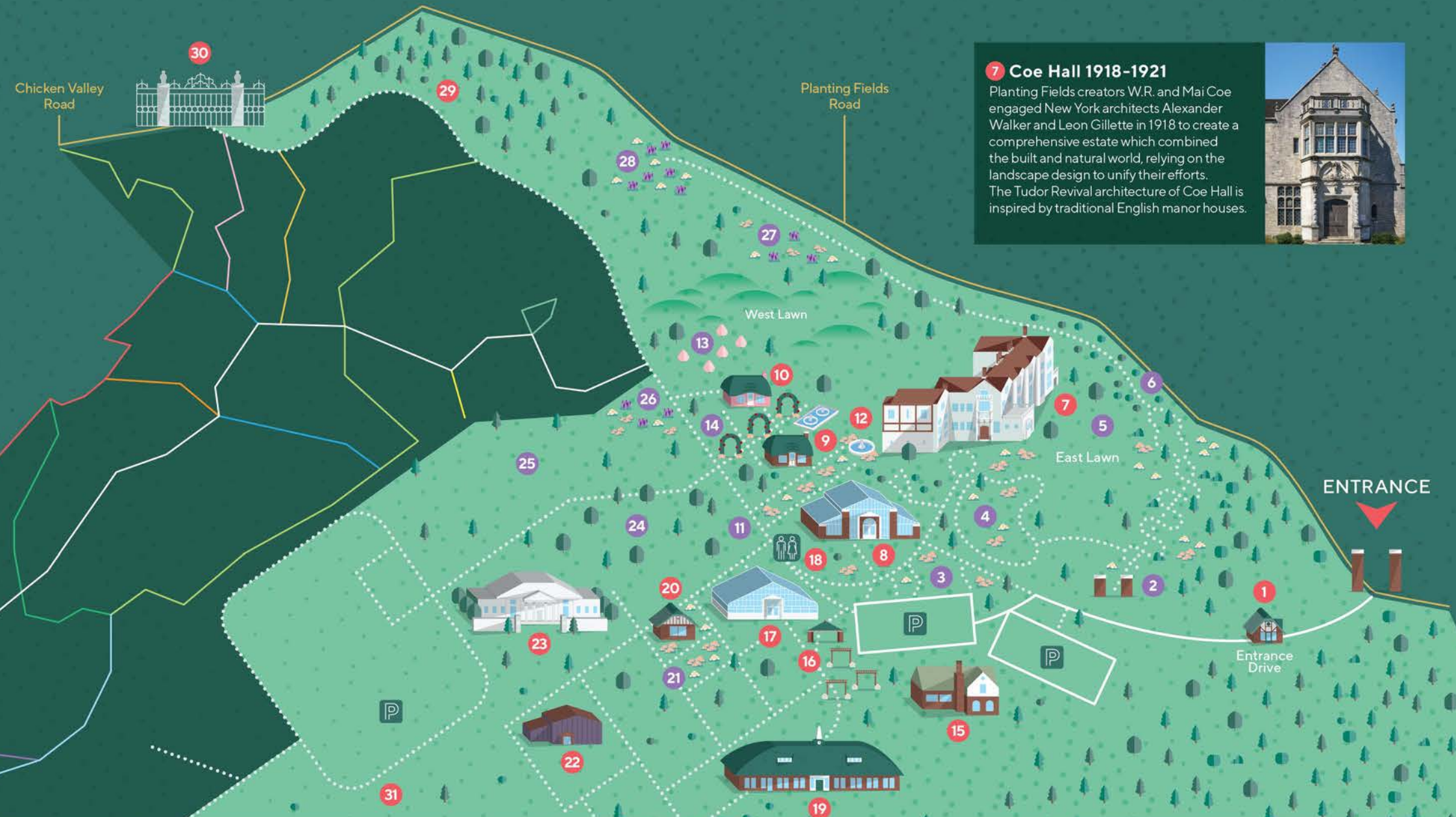

7 Coe Hall 1918-1921
 Planting Fields creators W.R. and Mai Coe engaged New York architects Alexander Walker and Leon Gillette in 1918 to create a comprehensive estate which combined the built and natural world, relying on the landscape design to unify their efforts. The Tudor Revival architecture of Coe Hall is inspired by traditional English manor houses.



8 Camellia Greenhouse 1917-1922
 This greenhouse (Lowell & Sargent, Olmsted Bros.) features the largest collection of camellias under glass in the northeast. The original collection was imported by W.R. Coe from the Isle of Guernsey in 1917 and about a quarter of the original plants still live in the greenhouse today. Hardy camellias can be found outside the greenhouse as well. The camellias have their peak bloom in February.



9 Italian Garden and Teahouse 1915
 The Italian Garden includes a Teahouse designed by Elsie de Wolfe, one of the most influential interior decorators of her time. The interior features commissioned murals and painted furniture by artist Everett Shinn as well as ornamental wrought-iron electric light fixtures, crafted to resemble bouquets of flowers inspired by 18th century French taste, all part of de Wolfe's signature style. This historic garden was renovated and reopened to the public in 2010, thanks to the collaborative efforts of Planting Fields Foundation and New York State Parks."



17 Main Greenhouse/Hibiscus House 1914-1929
 Five parallel glasshouses (Lowell & Sargent) are attached by a single large glasshouse (Olmsted Bros.). The large central greenhouse was originally called the "Hibiscus House" during the Coe family era, but is now a mixture of tropical plants as well as seasonal displays.
