The CLR strives to restore the Olmsted Brothers vision for this 409-acre estate. The Landscape Technician will collaborate closely with the Horticulture Manager, as well as New York State Parks staff and volunteers to ensure the best management practices of this landscape. The position is mostly hands-on with light administrative work. This is an exciting opportunity for an ideal candidate to join a growing organization embarking on the next phase of institutional growth.

### **Duties + Responsibilities**

- Collaborate closely with the Horticulture Manager to ensure that the restoration of the Olmsted Brothers' vision of Planting Fields is implemented, maintained, and preserved through the realization of the recommendations of the CLR.
- Assist in restoration installations, both hardscaping and soft scaping
- Understanding of maintenance best practices.
- Lead maintenance of site-specific projects.
- Daily debris removal in all gardens.
- Sweeping, edging, mowing and blowing all garden areas.
- Coordinate material drops (mulch, compost etc.) with NYS Parks staff.
- Light machinery operation including chainsaw, weedwhacker and woodchipper.
- Interface with contractors to provide access points to our gardens.
- Set up workstations for various horticulture projects.
- Check in with progress of restorations with project management software.
- Develop a familiarity with the living collections.
- Valid driver's license and reliable transportation.
- Ability and willingness to drive Golf Carts in the park around pedestrians.
- Occasional long days and weekends, especially in spring and fall.
- Perform other tasks and duties as assigned.

## **Qualifications + Requirements**

- Candidates must have the will to see a garden not just survive but thrive.
- Strong planting, weeding and watering practices.
- Understanding of soil and mulch types and strategies.
- Basic plant identification skill perennials, invasives, self-seeders, woodies, natives, trees.
- Reliable, on time, and ready to work.
- Self-starter has a list of things identified to do before being given direction.
- Planner, work is planned in 2-week sprints, not delegated day of.
- Experience working in a public garden or historic landscape preferred.
- Formal training in landscaping preferred.
- Proficient in team coordination technology, text, email, Asana, Outlook, Google Suite.
